Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) programs are community-based programs that bring together law enforcement, mental health professionals, mental health advocates (people living with mental illness and their families), and other partners to improve community responses to mental health crises. While CIT programs are known for CIT-trained officers, successful programs also focus on improving the crisis response system, advocating for needed services, and strengthening partnerships across the community.

Goals of A CIT Program

- To increase connections to effective and timely mental health services for people in mental health crisis.
- To reduce the trauma that people experience during a mental health crisis and thus contribute to their long-term recovery.
- To reform crisis response systems by increasing the role of mental health professionals, peer support specialists, and other community supports.
- To improve safety during law enforcement encounters with people experiencing a mental health crisis, while using law enforcement strategically: only when there is an imminent threat to safety or a criminal concern.
